Innovative partnership brings 'away-from-home' recycling programs to Canby area

St. Paul, MN - The Recycling Association of Minnesota (RAM) and Minnesota Waste Wise (MWW) will announce new recycling opportunities in the Canby area tomorrow. Message in a Bottle™, an away-from-home bottle and can recycling program managed by RAM, and It's in the Bag™, a plastic bag recycling program managed by Waste Wise, kicks off July 8, 2010 at the Canby Cenex with a massive "get caught recycling event".

Residents of the Canby area will now have easy to use recycling options while out and about to recycle beverage containers and plastic bags. The kickoff event is expected to draw quite a lot of attention from area residents as well as local representatives who are scheduled to come to support the new effort.

"There is a great need to have easily-accessible recycling programs when Minnesotans are on the go. Message in a Bottle™ (MIB) and It's in the Bag™ (IITB) fulfill this need," stated Ellen Telander, Executive Director of RAM.

Both of these recycling programs have been highly successful at convenience and grocery stores in the Twin Cities, St. Cloud, Mankato, Duluth, Hutchinson, Owatonna, and Hinckley. Success is partly due to the eye-catching recycling containers used by the programs. MIB containers are shaped like soda bottles and IITB containers are clear, making it easy to see what's inside. To date, MIB has recycled more than 750,000 pounds of beverage containers and other plastics. IITB has recycled more than 5.5 million pounds of plastic bags and shrink film. Local businesses that are participating include businesses in Canby, Dawson, Madison, Clarkfield, Minneota, Porter, and Ghent.

"It is a value-added service for customers of local businesses, it can save businesses money on waste disposal costs, and it provides jobs for Minnesotans," added Mark Blaiser, Executive Director of Waste Wise.

The programs are a partnership between RAM, MWW the Minnesota Beverage Association, the USDA Rural Development, and the Canby Development Achievement Center which employs adults with disabilities to collect, sort, and bale beverage containers, shrink film and plastic bags from area businesses. The program is expected to create at least 10 full time green jobs for the vocational center clients in the Canby area.

"This program will provide these individuals with rewarding, innovative employment opportunities and a chance to give back to the community," stated Pam Weckwerth, Executive Director of the Canby Developmental Achievement Center, of the clients at Canby DAC.

The program expansion is possible due in part to a grant from U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development's Solid Waste Management grant program which will provide funding to launch the programs in 10 additional areas throughout Minnesota. "The beauty of this program is that it becomes self-sustaining in six to twelve months time," said Telander.

"This program gives rural communities the tools and resources necessary to better manage waste disposal costs and reduce impact on the environment," said Colleen Landkamer, State Director for Rural Development in Minnesota. "I am proud that Rural Development was able to provide the funding to help make this collaboration possible and look forward to following this project as it develops."

The Minnesota Beverage Association along with other business partners has also provided matching funds for the grant program. "It is important that this highly successful recycling program be offered statewide. Minnesotans are great recyclers when given the opportunity," stated Joan Archer, Executive Director of the Minnesota Beverage Association.
