

Materials Banned from Minnesota Landfills:

- Asbestos
- Automobiles
- Automotive fluids:
 - Antifreeze
 - Automotive lubricants
 - Brake fluid
 - Power steering fluid
 - Used motor oil
 - Used oil filters
 - Sorbents, towels and wipes
- Batteries:
 - Rechargeable (Ni-MH, Li-Ion)
 - Mercury Oxide/Silver Oxide
 - Nickel-Cadmium (Ni-Cd)
 - Lead-Acid (Pb)
- Electronic Waste:
 - Electronic equipment with a display screen or monitor 7" or larger including: TVs, computer monitors and video devices
 - Computer systems including: CPUs, monitors, printers, scanners, keyboards, mice, speakers, etc.
 - Video players including: VCRs, DVD players, and DVRs
 - Facsimile machines and photocopiers
 - Cell Phones
- Explosives
- Fluorescent Bulbs
- Hazardous Waste
- Household Hazardous Waste
 - Anything household product with the words: Flammable, toxic, corrosive, poison or caution!, on the container.
- Infectious Waste
- Lead
- Major Appliances (White Goods):
 - Air Conditioners
 - Dehumidifiers
 - Dishwashers
 - Clothes washer and dryers

- Freezers
- Furnaces
- Microwave ovens
- Refrigerators
- Stoves
- Water Heaters
- Medical Sharps
- Mercury containing devices
- Paint
- Pathological Waste
- Pesticides
- Phone Books
- Railroad Ties
- Solvents:
 - Polish removers
 - Spot removers
 - Glue solvents
- Source Separated Recyclables:
 - Aluminum, steel, and tin beverage containers

 - Newspaper and newsprint
 - Office paper
